Hope and Preparation

Some thoughts collected by Canon Sarah Hildreth-Osborn

Advent is a season unlike any other in the Church's year. It is a time of waiting, of expectation, of longing. Yet it is not a passive waiting, as if we were simply counting down the days until Christmas. Advent is active, purposeful, and full of promise. It invites us to prepare our hearts, our homes, and our communities for the coming of Christ.

We often think of Advent in three dimensions. First, we look back to Bethlehem, to the child born in a stable, to the angels singing and shepherds rejoicing. Second, we look forward to Christ's coming again in glory, when God's kingdom will be complete and all creation renewed. And third, we look around us, to the present moment, recognising that Christ comes to us here and now—in the people we meet, in the prayers we offer, in the quiet moments of reflection and hope.

The symbols of Advent are rich with meaning. The Advent wreath, with its candles lit week by week, reminds us that light grows steadily in the darkness. The purple of the season speaks of both royalty and repentance, calling us to prepare with humility and joy. The readings we hear in church are full of

voices crying out in the wilderness, of valleys lifted up and mountains made low, of a people walking in hope. These images are not just poetry; they are promises. They tell us that God is at work, even when the world feels uncertain or heavy.

Advent also teaches us patience. In a culture that rushes towards Christmas with urgency and noise, Advent invites us to slow down, to breathe, to listen. It is a season of holy pause, reminding us that God's timing is not ours. (See overleaf for details of our Advent Quiet Day, an opportunity to put this into practice.) We wait not with anxiety, but with trust. We wait not in emptiness, but in hope. We wait knowing that the One who comes is faithful.

This waiting is not only personal; it is communal. Advent is a season for the whole Church, for families, for neighbours, for communities. We prepare together, we light candles together, we sing together, we pray together. In doing so, we

remind one another that we are not alone. Christ comes to us as Emmanuel—God with us—and that promise is shared by all.

So how might we live Advent well? Perhaps by setting aside a few minutes each day for quiet reflection. Perhaps by noticing the small signs of hope around

As we journey through Advent, let us hold fast to its promise: that light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. Christ is coming. Christ is near.

And in that hope, we find peace.






Dechrau Canu Dechrau Canmol comes to St Grwst's!

Canon Quentin Bellamy writes:

Niemoeller (1892-1984) was Martin German theologian and Lutheran pastor who was outspoken in his opposition to the Nazi regime. In fact, he was on Adolf Hitler's list of the people he most hated and feared. keep him quiet, Niemoeller was Months imprisoned. later he was summoned before a special court, and suddenly he began to feel afraid. He had no idea what to expect! As he was taken along the seemingly endless corridor from the prison cell to the courtroom, he heard a quiet voice.

As he listened, he realised that the voice was quoting from the Bible in Latin, the version used by the Roman Catholic Church. The voice whispered a verse from the Book of Proverbs. It began, "Nomen Domini turris fortissima" "The name of the Lord is a strong tower"; the verse goes on, "the righteous run to it and are safe" (Proverbs 18:10).

It was the jailer's voice. We don't know who he was, but what he said had an instant impact on Niemoeller — his fear vanished and his confidence in God was renewed. It was just as well that the other guards had no idea what was being said or else the owner of the voice would have joined Niemoeller!

Niemoeller survived the war and helped rebuild the church in Germany and especially led its people to face their guilt over what had happened. What this boils down to is that the perfect antidote for fear is trust in God. That's the experience that Niemoeller had as he was being taken down

the corridor of a Nazi prison to an uncertain future. The unknown guard whispered powerful words of encouragement, "The name of the Lord is a strong tower", reminding Niemoeller that God knew his situation and would give him the strength to face whatever lay ahead. And his fear vanished.

As I write these words the findings of the Covid 19 enquiry have been made public, and looking back, who would ever have believed what happened in those dark days when the order to "stay at home" came. Loved ones in residential care, only able to see family and friends through the window; children's education thrown into disarray and chaos; and churches, closed and locked, with entry forbidden. These were only a few of the consequences of that seemingly endless series of lockdowns, and a spirit of fear and uncertainty prevailed. If ever we needed the Lord, we certainly needed him then.

When the lockdown was lifted and people were once more allowed to return to church, I couldn't help but notice how all the joy that we had previously known in worship had all but evaporated. The atmosphere was heavy, and leading worship and building up renewed enthusiasm was really hard work — it was a spiritual battle on a very large scale. I have to admit that I found the whole situation very perplexing and pretty discouraging. It's easy to talk about being positive as a Christian, but I remember my father once saying that it's not always the easiest thing for a Christian to remain on the victory side.

Have you experienced times of discouragement? Have you found it hard to be on the victory side? Believe me, if you haven't, you will. That's life!

The breakdown of a relationship,
The loss of a job,
The doctor walks into the room and shakes his head sadly

And all these things can strike us and lead us to despair and discouragement. What do we do then?

Well perhaps we can go to our old friend, Paul the Apostle, who had some sound advice for the folks in Thessalonica when they were going through times of great discouragement. He wrote "Therefore encourage and build one another up" (1 Thessalonians 5:11).

Sometimes we get at odds with each other. Sometimes we do grow weary. But when we dedicate ourselves to the Lord and belong to a community of faith, through the power of God's Holy Spirit, we can help each other hold on, we can support and strengthen one another, we can rejoice with each other. Because through our faith in the Lord Jesus Christ we are able to have one spirit, one heart, one purpose.

And with all of that in mind, at the start of 2026 we're going to have a very special Epiphany Service of Encouragement for the Aberconwy Mission Area, when we'll be welcoming Bishop Gregory as our special guest speaker. He is certain to have a message to encourage us as we enter the new year together. This service will take place at St David's Church in Penrhyn Bay on Sunday 4th January at 3.00 pm — that time has been chosen to enable you to enjoy a time of worship and fellowship with believers from across the Mission Area, and to get home before dark!

So the message to you dear Reader, is that no matter what life's circumstances may be, and the going can get very tough indeed — no matter what — we should never be discouraged because we have a great and mighty God, and he is in control. He will take all things that we offer in his Service and use them in ways which we could never even begin to imagine, and when we see him on that great day, he'll say "Well done, good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Lord".

Be encouraged – God is in control. Keep the Faith..... Hallelujah!





The Strollers are back on the trail!


Andrew James writes:

The wildlife was stunning and did not seem to mind the weather at all. First up we saw


